Supporting your child with phonics and reading

Next week, we are taking part in the Reading is Magic Festival. This 5 day event is the brainchild of the last Children's Laureate Cressida Cowell (author of the How to Train your Dragon books). The key message is **Reading is magic and magic is for everyone**.



We will be participating in various online author sessions, pairing up with our friends in different year groups to read as well as celebrating books and stories in our own classes. Over the week we will be highlighting one or more of the five points from Cowell's Reading Charter, which declares that 'every child has the right to ...

- ... be creative for at least 15 minutes a week
- ... have a planet to read on
- ... see themselves reflected in a book
- ...have some choice in what they read
- ... read for the joy of it'

We are very excited! The children at Twineham talk expressively and passionately about their love of reading and stories, and as a school we believe that reading is the key to unlocking potential.

How you can help at home: please make sure your child has a reading book in school everyday - especially next week. We'd love to see pictures of where the children read at home.
