We have enjoyed One World Week, playing sporting fixtures and the busy run up to Christmas and have been successful at achieving the Sainsbury's Gold Mark Sports award one of only 7 schools in Mid Sussex to do so. We did it! We got Gold!

The Sainsbury's School Games Mark is a Government led awards scheme. It was launched in 2012 to reward schools for their commitment to the development of competition across their school and into the community. All registered schools in England are able to assess themselves across bronze, silver and gold levels of the Mark.

As a member of Mid Sussex Active, the organisation that supports us in a wide variety of ways, including provision of competitions, professional development and expanding the sporting opportunities for all, we were only 1 of 7 schools to gain the Gold Mark. Also Mid Sussex Active came 6th in the country in relation to the number of member schools being awarded the Sainsburys Mark (43 in total). An amazing achievement!

On Friday a celebration assembly was held at Twineham which was attended by other schools in the area who had also achieved the Sainsbury's Mark. The awards were handed out by Craig Figes, the GB Water Polo captain. He talked to the children about his experiences and how he found his sport, there was also a video of some of his highlights which the children really enjoyed followed by the opportunity to get his autograph.

This is an amazing achievement and demonstrates the variety of sporting opportunities offered to the children. Well done to all staff and children in achieving this.

Message from ASCEND Special Educational Needs Hub

Your school is involved in the set-up of a Special Educational Needs Hub, which is going to be providing support and advice for schools and parents regarding children with additional needs. You may be aware that a behaviour workshop was arranged before the summer holidays, which was very well attended by parents from schools in our local area.

ASCEND are currently organising some staff training events, linked closely to what school staff are telling us they need. In addition, the hub has set up a pilot 'Professionals Project'. Three professionals have been employed to specifically target the areas of most need within the 20 schools that form our locality. Cuts at Local Authority level have meant that accessing professionals has been more difficult in recent times, and so we hope that this project will begin to fill some of the gaps that schools are experiencing. Currently these professionals are a Speech and Language Therapist (working primarily with children with lower level needs in Year 1), a Primary Mental Health Worker (working primarily with Year 6 children, to assist smooth transition to secondary school) and a Play Therapist (working with higher level emotional needs in upper key stage 2). We hope to extend this project if it is successful. These specialists may be working with children within our school at different times during the year. This is all part of our aim to identify potential issues at an early stage, in an attempt to prevent issues from growing.

Blackthorns is the lead school for the ASCEND hub, and the project is being led by Karen Crockford. Please feel free to contact me if you have any questions about the hub or any of the projects we are currently working on.
