History – We will place the Anglo-Saxon period in context chronologically. Children can learn about key figures King Alfred the Great, William the Conqueror.  English – Etymology - can we spot Anglo-Saxon and Norman words can it help our spelling?  Science – We will explore the properties of materials. Also, we will study light, vision and sight.  PE – Building stamina with long distance running. This term we will be swimming.	Computing – Using software and skills to communicate ideas about history to each other.  Art and DT – Learning skills in calligraphy, illumination and embroidery. Includes our own Bayeux tapestry.  Music – Children will be learning to play the recorder. We will also listen to Harp music to create an understanding of the development of music throughout history.	English – The epic poetry of Beowulf will provide the children with opportunities to explore a high quality text. The art of story-telling. Building on our story writing skills. History/Geography – We will look at the reasons for the human migrations from Northern Europe to the UK and Ireland in Saxon times.  French – We will be consolidating our WWII learning from last year by using this as a French theme.	RE – The Gospels. What are they and why is this 'good news' still important to Christians and others?  RSHE – Children will receive a number of lessons aimed at strengthening their emotional health and wellbeing. Including: managing emotions, the importance of sleep and coping with worries.	Change –We will be considering current migrations and invasions that are effecting the world.
